I. Community Workshops and Outreach (January 1, 2019 – January 5, 2024)

Total Outreach January 2019 to November 2023 – Over 13,863 people (including over 2,362 between January 2023 and January 5, 2024)

- 1. January 19, 2019 33rd Annual MLK Day Breakfast, Brockton, MA, hosted by the Brockton-Area NAACP. AdMeTech provided a full-page awareness ad and educational materials (>500 attendees, with over 90% representing African American community).
- February 11, 2019 Press Coverage by Thor Jourgensen, Editor of Lynn's The Item (and ItemLive.com) on prostate cancer, based on the interviews with Dr. Faina Shtern; Dr. Geoff Pechinsky, Lynn Community Health Center's Chief Medical Officer; and Representative Daniel Cahill. II. Ongoing, Sustainable Programs (January 2019 to January 5, 2024)

Total Outreach January 2019 to November 2023: Over 37,768 (including over 11,871 between January 1, 2023 and January 5, 2024)

In addition to individual workshops, AdMeTech-led Prostate Cancer Action Council has also established and supported the ongoing, sustainable programs for vulnerable and underserved populations. These programs include state-wide programs created with NEAC NAACP and Latino Health Insurance Program and their multiple branches located across the state. Also, we have been supporting Center for Elimination of Health and Social Inequities and Disparities, or CEHSID, focusing its work on Suffolk, Norfolk, Essex and Middlesex Counties; Men of Color Health Awareness, or MOCHA, focusing its work on the Hampden County in the Greater Springfield Metropolitan Area; and Community Health Awareness Program (CHAN) in Worcester County.

- 1) <u>New England Area Conference of NAACP (NEAC NAACP) and its State-Wide Branches, with Brockton</u> <u>in Plymouth County as a priority.</u>
 - A) Since 2015, we have been supporting and holding prostate cancer workshops at the Annual Conference of NEAC NAACP in September-October (attended by over 75 branch leaders and activists) and providing a full-page public awareness ad and educational materials for the Annual New England Civil Rights Hall of Fame Dinner (attended by over 300 members). NEAC NAACP Outreach was 520 members, including over 70 participants in January 2023). These include the Hall of Fame Dinner in April 2019, 75 Branch Leaders in October 2019 and 75 Branch Leaders in October 2020, and over 70 leaders in 2023). Most participants (>95%) were from the African American community. AdMeTech presented prostate cancer workshop on January 27-28, 2023 at the NEAC NAACP Annual meeting again (attendance: over 60 regional and local leaders)
 - B) Brockton, Plymouth County has been our priority since 2015, when Plymouth County had the state's highest mortality in Black men. This program is a joint effort with Brockton NAACP and Good Samaritan Medical Center. This program includes:
 - b) Biweekly conference calls of the Executive Committee for developing strategy and its implementation, and reviewing the progress achieved;
 - *c)* Providing educational materials and assistance for the Annual MLK Breakfast of the Brockton NAACP. These events took place in January 2019, January 2020, January 2021, January 2022, and January 21, 2023 with more than 500 attendees each year (*total over 2,500 participants*).
 - d) Ongoing Prostate Cancer Awareness Days. These events took place on March 14, September 15 and October 27, 2019 at local churches as mentioned above (total over 200 attendees, with over 95% men and women of color). Due to COVID-19 Pandemic, we also held three Virtual Individual Workshops on COVID-19 and Prostate Cancer in May, June and September 2020, as well as March, June, and September 2021. The September 9, 2021 event was held jointly with the Blue Hills Avenue Area Branch of NAACP. (The events since January 2020 reached 4,747 people;



- e) April 13, 2019 –Health Fair at the Messiah Baptist Church in Brockton. This event had over 100 people (over 99% Black individuals), and 35 people approached AdMeTech's table exhibit to engage in a discussion about prostate cancer and obtain educational materials. During this event, Dr. Faina Shtern led a group discussion on the recent advances in prostate cancer care;
- f) Leaders of the Brockton NAACP include AdMeTech's educational banners and materials at multiple local and regional health fairs and festivals;
- g) In August-September 2019, a high-profile Prostate Cancer Awareness Billboard was created and displayed;
- h) On March 6, 2020, Brockton Community Access (BCA) TV had a formal educational interview on prostate cancer and related disparities with Dr. Faina Shtern of AdMeTech and Mr. Steven Bernard of the Brockton NAACP. This is a part of the ongoing joint effort with BCA TV and its NAACP Forum, a popular show reaching most local residents. This includes educational interviews with Brockton NAACP, AdMeTech, local community leaders and medical professionals, including Good Samaritan Medical Center. In 2021, BCA interviews took place on January 19 and June 2 (see above, including 57 views). On February 8, 2022, BCA will interview Drs. Shtern and Trinh about the Prostate Cancer Equity Program. On March 14, 2019, during the Prostate Cancer Awareness Day, BCA has produced and since that time, consistently aired a program service announcement, featuring Black men who were impacted by our awareness program – including a 49 year old African American man who was empowered to ensure early detection of his lethal prostate cancer and a 60 year old man with a family history of prostate cancer, who learned about being at high risk for the first time during our event in February 2018;
- i) On April 27, 2022 the Brockton branch of the NAACP in conjunction with AdMeTech hosted a virtual educational event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID (over 100 attendees and 69 reached).
- j) On October 13, 2022 the Brockton branch of the NAACP in conjunction with AdMeTech hosted a virtual educational event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID (69 attendees and 93 reached).
- k) On May 4, 2023 the Brockton branch of the NAACP in conjunction with AdMeTech hosted a virtual educational event on prostate cancer (273 attendees and 448 reached).
- I) On October 17th, 2023 the Brockton branch of the NAACP in conjunction with AdMeTech hosted a virtual educational event on prostate cancer (60 attendees and 50 reached).
- m) Coverage by the Brockton Enterprise (daily newspaper for Brockton and nearby towns of Plymouth, Bristol and Norfolk Counties with <u>daily circulation of 22,500 to 35,500</u>):
 - i. On March 11, 2019 (before March 14, 2019 event) <u>"Black men at higher risk of prostate cancer"</u>; and
 - ii. On March 19, 2019 (after March 14, 2019 event) -- "It can't be me".

In summary, the Brockton outreach included over 8,567 people. In addition, the majority of the Brockton population was reached by the TV and print media, as well as a high-profile billboard.

Impact: According to the latest NCI data in 2023, prostate cancer mortality in White and Black men in Plymouth County has become lower than state-average, with a sharply reduced disparity in mortality in Black vs. White men. In sharp contrast, during the same period of time, there have been no significant reduction in prostate cancer health disparities at the state level.



C) Merrimack Valley NAACP – Over the last year, as mentioned above, we held two events on June 15, 2019 and January 30, 2020 (with total attendance >315 participants, mostly members of the African American community). Jointly with Merrimack Valley NAACP, we also had a prostate cancer workshop at the MLK Breakfast in January 2022 (over 300 people). On January 16, 2023, we held a prostate cancer workshop at the MLK Breakfast, with attendance of over 300 people. The estimated outreach in Merrimack Valley is over 615 people, with 1,215 reached since January 2020.

D) Springfield NAACP – Prostate Cancer Workshop at the Freedom Fund Dinner on September 17, 2020 hosted by Bishop Talbert Swan (>300 participants). On September 16, 2021, we participated in their Freedom Fund Dinner by hosting a prostate cancer workshop (>300 participants). On October 27, 2022, we participated in their Freedom Fund Dinner by hosting a prostate cancer workshop (>300 participants). On October 19, 2023, we participated in their Freedom Fund Dinner (>300 participants). Jointly with Springfield NAACP, we have reached over **1,200** people in the Springfield area since January 2020.

E) Mystic Valley NAACP –Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on October 25, 2020 (334 views and 596 people reached). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID took place on October 24, 2021 (264 people reached and 121 views). We had our virtual event with Mystic Valley NAACP on prostate cancer in the times of COVID on October 29, 2022 (78 people reached and 95 views). We had our virtual event with Mystic Valley NAACP on October 11, 2023 (75 people reached and 50 views). Jointly with the Mystic Valley NAACP, we have reached over **1060** people since January 2020.

F) North Shore NAACP–Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on November 18, 2021 (54 views and 84 people reached and 20 people on Zoom). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID took place on November 5, 2022 (52 people reached, 77 views and 12 people on Zoom). An event with North Shore NAACP is scheduled for March 2024. Jointly with the North Shore NAACP, we have reached over **193** people since January 2020.

G) Martha's Vineyard NAACP–Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on October 28, 2021 (478 views and 945 people reached). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID took place on October 20, 2022 (119 people reached and 71 views). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer took place on November 2, 2023 (65 people reached and 60 views). Jointly with the Martha's Vineyard NAACP, we have reached over **1,129** people since January 2020.

H) New Bedford NAACP–Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on November 4, 2021 (50 views and 39 people reached plus 20 people on Zoom). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer in the times of COVID took place on November 10, 2022 (62 people reached plus 10 people on Zoom and 66 views). The virtual annual event on prostate cancer took place on November 16, 2023 (60 people reached plus 40 view). Jointly with the New Bedford NAACP, we have reached over **185** people since January 2020.

I) Boston NAACP–Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on November 21, 2021 (*158 views and 352 people reached*). Virtual Prostate Cancer Awareness Event took place on January 24, 2023 (*120 views and 328 people reached*). Jointly with the Boston NAACP, we have reached over **680**



people since January 2020.

J) Worcester NAACP – Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on January 24, 2022 (26 views and 87 people reached and 20 people on Zoom). Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness took place on May 9, 2023 (36 views and 82 people reached and 10 people on Zoom). Jointly with the Cambridge NAACP, we have reached over **189** people.

k) Cambridge NAACP - Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness in Times of COVID-19 Pandemic: Know Your Risks & Take Charge of Your Health took place on June 25, 2022 (171 views and 334 people reached). Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness took place on June 15, 2023 (108 views and 313 people reached and 7 people on Zoom). Jointly with the Cambridge NAACP, we have reached over **647** people.

I) Berkshire NAACP – Virtual Educational Event Prostate Cancer Awareness took place on January 3, 2024 (over 20 attendees).

K) We are planning to expand our program with NEAC NAACP Branches. With support of the NEAC NAACP leadership, we have had discussions with Presidents and/or Health Chairs of the following additional branches: Berkshire, Blue Hills Avenue, and Cape Cod. On January, 2024, we are planning the first joint prostate awareness event with the Berkshire NAACP.

In summary, the total Community Outreach with NEAC NAACP and Branches: Over **15,905** people total, mostly members of the African American Community, since 2019.

In addition, the majority of the Brockton population was reached by the local TV, newspapers and other media, and educational outreach was expanded in Suffolk, Cambridge, Middlesex County, and New Bedford, Bristol County. Boston Globe covered the educational event hosted by the North Shore Branch jointly with AdMeTech Foundation.

Plan for FY'25:

- a) To expand current joint individual workshops and ongoing programs;
- b) To expand joint efforts with Springfield NAACP, Boston NAACP, Cambridge NAACP and Cambridge Health Alliance, Berkshire NAACP, Mystic Valley NAACP and New Bedford NAACP to address Black and Hispanic men's increased mortality and related disparities in Hampden, Suffolk, Middlesex, Bristol and Norfolk Counties (per NCI State Cancer Profile Report of 2023).
- 2) <u>Suffolk, Norfolk, Middlesex and Essex Counties</u> A joint effort with the Center for Elimination of Health and Social Inequities and Disparities, or CEHSID. With AdMeTech's support, CEHSID established an ongoing Innovative Prostate Cancer Educational Program for High Risk Men, centered on the barbershop outreach, community health centers, community programs and faith-based organizations.

Between March and June, 2019 - CEHSID has focused on the educational events and counseling in multiple Black Churches, with primary focus on the Suffolk and Norfolk Counties, including Concord Baptist Church in Milton; Faith Christian Church in Mattapan/Dorchester; Historic Holy Tabernacle Church in Dorchester; Greater Love Tabernacle in Dorchester; and Tabernacle of Praise in Randolph (102 were counseled and 100 men attended educational workshops, with 202 total men served).

Between July and December 2019 - CEHSID has focused on *individual counseling of 120 men*. Between January and September 2020, CEHSID *counseled 360 men*. On October 20, 2020, CEHSID organized the New England Men's Health Disparities Virtual Conference that reached over 100 people.



In 2020, CEHSID broadened community outreach in Suffolk and Norfolk Counties and expanded educational programs and counseling *beyond their borders to Middlesex and Essex Counties* (see Target Areas below). For example:

- 1) Barbershop outreach included, but was not limited to, Symphony Barbers in Roslindale, Roslindale Barbers, and Classic Cuts in Hyde Park;
- 2) Community programs, including 25 organizations that collaborate with the Caribbean American Carnival Association and organize a Carnival Parade, which took place on August 24, 2019;
- 3) Sports organizations, leagues and associations; and
- 4) Cultural and social clubs throughout the Greater Boston Area (e.g., Dorchester, Roxbury, Mattapan and Roslindale).

CEHSID'S High-Risk Target Areas:

1) Suffolk County - Roxbury, Mattapan, Dorchester, Roslindale, Hyde Park, South Boston, Revere, Chelsea;

2) Norfolk County: Dedham, Norwood, Canton, Stoughton, Avon, Randolph, Westwood, Walpole, Quincy, Weymouth;

3) Middlesex County: Cambridge, Sommerville, Everett; and

4) Essex County: Lynn, Saugus.

In Summary, between early March and December 2019, CEHSID served a total of 322 high-risk men of color, located in underserved areas. This program included educational workshops for 100 men and individual counseling for 222 men. Between January and October 2020, CEHSID served 360 men. Between January and December 2021, CEHSID served 480 men. The total number of 1,162 men served between March 2019 and June 2021, including 840 men since January 2020. Between July 2021 and December 2022, CEHSID reached an additional 720 people. Between January 2023 and June 2023, CEHSID reported to have reached an additional 240 people. The total number of people reached by CEHSID between January 2020 and June 2023 is over 1,904 people.

 Latino Health Insurance Program – State-Wide Effort to Serve Hispanic and Portuguese Communities, with <u>Headquarters in Framingham</u> in Middlesex County and Branches in East Boston in Suffolk County, and Worcester and Milford in the Worcester County. On August 1, 2019, AdMeTech has trained four medical professionals of LHIP to conduct individual counseling and provided related educational materials, translated into Spanish and Portuguese.

Between August and December 2019, *LHIP conducted individual counseling with 105 Hispanic and Portuguese men.*

Between January and June 2020, 578 men were educated, resulting in 235 men getting screened and 12 men diagnosed with prostate cancer. Out of these 12 men with prostate cancer, 10 individuals had treatable disease and 2 men had end-stage malignancy.

Since that time, on February 1, 2021, Dr. Milagros Abreu, Founder of LHIP, announced that as the direct results of a joint program with AdMeTech Foundation, *LHIP professionals educated and* counseled over *5,000 high-risk individuals total, including members of the Hispanic, Portuguese and African American communities.*

LHIP's High-Risk Target Areas include Brockton, Framingham, Jamaica Plain, Saugus, Lynn, Milford, Worcester, East Boston and other areas.



In summary, between July 2019 and February 2, 2021, about *5,683 men* have been educated and counseled by LHIP. This includes 235 men who chose screening and 12 men diagnosed with prostate cancer, including 10 men with treatable disease and 2 men with end-stage prostate cancer.

Since March 2021, LHIP has served additional 684 men, with 573 men opting for screening, and 3 men diagnosed with treatable prostate cancer.

In summary, LHIP has served over 6,367 men since 2019, including 6,367 men served since January 2020.

In January 2022, LHIP committed to serving an additional 858 men, which were reported for the period between January 2022 and June 2022, reaching over 7,326 people.

For the period between January- June 2023, LHIP served additional 886 men, reaching over 8,212 people total since 2019.

- 4) <u>Springfield Metropolitan Area, Hampden County</u> In cooperation with and support from the AdMeTech Foundation, Men of Color Health Awareness (MOCHA) established an ongoing program of prostate cancer education and awareness since January 2019. This program has the following main components and reported the following progress in FY'20, including but not limited to:
 - A) Conducting 4 focus groups for 38 people between July and November 2019 in-person; and 3 focus groups for 23 people between January 2020 and June 2020, including virtual events, for education and assessing the comprehensibility of the educational materials developed by the Expert Panel convened by AdMeTech. The focus groups were also conducted in June and July 2021, with 11 men participating. These focus groups included primarily African American men and women.
 - B) Distributing prostate cancer educational materials at multiple, including annual and weekly, community events at which MOCHA has tables to conduct outreach education about health disparities in fulfilling MOCHA's mission. For example, MOCHA has been managing a table exhibit at the Mason Square Community Health Center every Tuesday, at the Deborah Hunt Community Center every Wednesday, Arise for Social Justice on Thursday, the Martin Luther King Food Pantry also on Thursdays, and at the After Incarceration Support Services (AISS) program on Monday evenings.
 - C) Organizing prostate cancer community education events. In FY'20, these events included:
 - i. Men's Health Fellowship Breakfast at Macedonia Church of God, where MOCHA led discussion on prostate cancer on August 17, 2019. Featured Speaker: Dr. Andrew Balder, Baystate Health. *This event was attended by estimated 150 people; and*
 - ii. Virtual Educational Townhall hosted jointly with Rep. Bud Williams (D-Springfield) and MOCHA on June 18, 2020 (340 virtual attendees)
 - D) Incorporating prostate cancer educational materials into MOCHA's on-going National Institute of Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD)-funded randomized controlled trial (RCT) retention activities, where MOCHA is holding one event each month during the three-month wait-list control period to bolster retention in the RCT.
 - E) Conducting weekly radio appearances by Brother Al Hubert on local public radio show (WTCC 90.1 FM) targeting the African-American and Latino communities and including prostate cancer education.
 - F) Posting posters and flyers (developed by AdMeTech) to raise prostate cancer awareness in 12 barber shops serving the African-American and Latino communities in the greater Springfield area;



- G) *Educating and mobilizing* 50 local residents for the Annual Prostate Cancer Awareness Day, which was planned for March 26, 2020 (the latter event was canceled by the state due to the COVID-19 pandemic). Participating in and mobilizing over 50 men for the Annual Prostate Cancer Awareness Day, which took place on February 25, 2021 and other AdMeTech's educational events (e.g., with Mystic Valley and Brockton NAACP).
- H) Speaking at the Virtual Annual Symposium of the Massachusetts Prostate Cancer Coalition on May 14, 2021.
- I) Every Thursday in September 2021, MOCHA spoke about Prostate Cancer awareness at the Pan African Historical Museum.
- J) In September 2021, MOCHA reported reaching over 100 men.
- K) From November 2021- January 2022, MOCHA has reported to have reached over 195 men by having various events.;
- L) For February-April 2022, MOCHA has reached at least 312 people;
- M) In May 2022, MOCHA reached at least 65 people;
- N) In June-July 2022, MOCHA reached at least 44 people;
- O) In August 2022, MOCHA reached at least 50 people;
- P) In September-December 2022, MOCHA reached at least 512 people.
- Q) In January- June 2023, MOCHA reached at least 851 people.

In summary, MOCHA's Prostate Cancer Education and Awareness Program reached 188 men between July and November 2019, mostly members of the African American community. Between January and June 2020, MOCHA served 348 people. In 2021, MOCHA reached over 150 people, and had 11 men taking part in focus groups. **Total of over 996** people were served by MOCHA between July 2019 and January 2022, including 808 since January 2020. Many more high-risk individuals and their families were reached through multiple local events attended by MOCHA and by the Radio Programs dedicated to prostate cancer education and awareness (WTCC 90.1 FM). Between February and December 2022, MOCHA reached at least 983 people. Between January and June 2023, MOCHA reached 851 people. The total MOCHA outreach between January 2020 and June 2023: **2,792** people.

- 5) Worcester County: Since this county has had the highest prostate cancer mortality over the last few years until August 2021 per National Cancer Institute, we have expanded our partnership with **Community Health Awareness Network Grows Equity** (CHANGE) and University of Massachusetts to establish an ongoing program in 2021.
 - a) CHANGE has reached over 150 people via a virtual educational event on May 2, 2021 and 40 people via a virtual educational event on October 5, 2021 (see above) and the in-person, socially-distanced sustainable Barbershops Outreach Campaign between March 1 and June 30, 2021. CHANGE will continue and expand this program. Total of over 190 people were served by CHANGE between May 2021 and June 2021 through virtual educational events.
 - b) Between July and November 2021, CHANGE reached out to about 250-300 at-risk individuals
 - c) Between December 2021 and December 2022, CHANGE reached over 272 people
 - d) Between January 2023 and December 2023, CHANGE reached over 425 people.

The total number of people reached by CHANGE between May 2021 and December 2022 is over 762 people.



In summary, CHANGE's Prostate Cancer Education and Awareness Program reached 190 men virtually between May and October of 2021 during virtual events. Between July and November of 2021, they have reached out to over 300 at risk individuals, and 272 between December 2021 and December 2022. **Total of over 1,187** people were served by CHANGE.

- 6) Lincoln Congregational Church- In cooperation with and support from the AdMeTech Foundation, Lincoln Congregational Church established an ongoing program of prostate cancer education and awareness since January 2023. This program has been serving Brockton and Easton and surrounding communities and includes, but is not limited, to the following main components;
 - a) Social media campaign to raise awareness.
 - b) Infomercials and TV interviews to be aired on Brockton Community Access Television.
 - c) Interfacing with pastors and church officials in the Brockton area, along with distribution of flyers.

Between January and December 2023, Lincoln Congregational team has reached over 6,825 people.

- 7) **Prostate Cancer Equity Program (State-Wide)** has been formally launched at the Prostate Cancer Awareness Day on March 31, 2022 to expedite access of men to the leading experts in clinical care. Since that time, over 951 people were reached in total, including 93 in 2023:
 - A network of six leading experts has been created (representing Mass General Brigham, University of Massachusetts, Greater Boston Urology, Boston University, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Andover Urology Practice and other clinical organizations);
 - b) An expedited, VIP-style referral process has been developed;
 - c) Research project has been designed to study quantitative patient outcomes;
 - d) Over 58 men were referred to the leading clinical experts;
 - e) Multiple Community Coordinators (8) have been recruited, who in turn, mobilized over 75 Program Ambassadors among the leaders of Black Churches, community, educational and advocacy organizations;
 - f) Nine Focus Groups have been held to optimize the program strategy and materials, with the total participation of 305 people (see above).

III. Plans for FY 2025 (July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025): Focus on Populations at High Risk for Prostate Cancer in the Areas of High Mortality and Related Disparities:

- 1) Expansion of the State-Wide Educational Workshops and Community Outreach;
- 2) Expansion of the Current Sustainable Programs (e.g., Suffolk County, Hampden County, Middlesex County, Bristol County, Merrimack Valley, Mystic Valley, and Norfolk County);
- 3) Creating new sustainable educational and awareness programs, with the focus on:
 - A. Hampden County (having the state's highest prostate cancer mortality in Black and Hispanic men) jointly with Springfield NAACP; MOCHA and LHIP;
 - B. Suffolk and Norfolk Counties Jointly with Boston NAACP, LHIP and other multiple organizations;



- C. Middlesex County Jointly with Cambridge NAACP, Cambridge Health Alliance, LHIP and faith-based organizations;
- D. Worcester County Worcester NAACP, Community Health Awareness Network (CHAN), , LHIP, local churches and University of Massachusetts;
- E. Bristol County, with the priority focus on:
 - a) New Bedford jointly with New Bedford NAACP, Greater New Bedford Health Center, Human Relations Commission, and local TV; and
 - b) Fall River jointly with the local community organizations and Black churches and other.
- F. Expansion of our state-wide programs with NEAC NAACP and Latino Health Insurance Program, with the focus on the Greater Springfield area (MOCHA, Spingfield NAACP) in Hampden County; Framingham (LHIP Headquarters), Cambridge and surrounding areas in the Middlesex County; Greater Boston in Suffolk County (Boston Branch of NAACP, East Boston Branch of LHIP, CEHSID, faith-based organizations), and Martha's Vineyard and Berkshire Branches of NAACP.
